When it seemed that the world had forgotten the children of Somalia as they were threatened by famine, forced from home, kept out of school ...

... something extraordinary happened. People like you stepped in through ALWS!

Early in 2023, ALWS secured an 18:1 Matching Grant with partners from Europe and the US to support children in Somalia to go to school.

Our ALWS commitment for Year 1 was \$150,000.

That's when love and kindness began pouring in from people like you!

Our Year 1 commitment has been met. Plus, Year 2! Plus, Year 3! That's 18:1 x 3 years for 8,080 children in Somalia to go to school! Thank you!



Sahra was forced to drop out of school at Grade 2 to look after her siblings. Before your help, Sahra said:

"From dawn to dusk we girls are always burdened with doing something."

Now, in just two years of your support at school through ALWS, she's reached Grade 6:

"Now I am able to read and write!

Your generosity provides each child with a School Kit with everything from books and pencils to school uniform.

Plus, you provide a School Lunch of porridge each day for the whole year.

Plus, you train teachers and renovate classrooms

All with a special focus on girls, to protect them from being forced into early marriage or child labour. You also make sure children with disabilities don't miss out!

A military junta has ruled Myanmar since February 2021. Despite this, in 2022 you reached 87,170 people inside Myanmar, and 22,638 people who fled to Bangladesh. Your work continues inside Displaced Persons Camps, supporting children to go to school, and rebuilding after Cyclone Mocha.

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
As climate changes, natural disasters hurt the world's poorest communities more. In 2022, you supported ALWS action to help 267,279 of these people. In 2023, you have already supplied \$100,000 worth of emergency aid to families hit by the Turkiye/Syria earthquake.

Blessed by you, to now bless you!

Effendi was 16 when disease left him unable to walk. His parents sold everything to pay for treatment, but nothing helped. Before your help through ALWS and our partner in Indonesia, CDRM&CDS, Effendi felt challenged that he now needed to use a wheelchair...

"I felt so frustrated. I could talk and think but I could not move any other part of my body.

By now, my parents had no money, so they put me in a room in their house and I stayed like that for the next 8 years. There was much stigma from the community, and my mother would be teased and be crying because of it.

I didn't think I would live, but my father and mother were committed to caring for me."

Through ALWS, you support more than a hundred people with disability through PK Hephata Centre. This is when Effendi's life changed:

"I was feeling very distressed because my brain was working but my body was not working.

When I went to the Centre, I saw many others with disability. Many of them could not talk or think properly, but they were laughing and happy.

This changed my mind-set when I realised others were in a worse situation, but they could still be happy. I started to accept my condition, and this began the healing inside of me."

Effendi was supported by his friends to do a Batik Training Course. He was inspired to open a business, and you have supported him to expand.

"We are the only Batik business in this area, and we are making Batak Batik designs. Every time we make a piece, we pray over it so that it can bless the receiver.

In the future we want to share our skills with others so that they can learn.

What we are doing would be impossible if we just tried to do it by ourselves. It is only possible because others helped us and encouraged us, so now I want to help others."
