"Kitchen gardening is done by pupils under the guidance of the agriculture teacher. It is part of class work. It helps to enhance learning, and encourages a farming culture. It also grows vegetables to meet their nutrition needs by supplementing the food basket."

Your very special Gifts of Grace grows this School Kitchen Garden:

- Set up School Club to care for School Garden
- **Prepare land** dig and partition the farm
- Establish **seed beds** and sow vegetables
- Water plants until ready for transplanting
- Teach value of vegetables in a healthy diet
- Sell surplus to buy essentials like salt and sugar
- Veggies encourages parents to **send children** to school

More than a garden, you give a whole School Food Farm! Once it is set up, it is self-sustaining. Yours is a gift that keeps on growing!

"We water the vegetables every morning at 6.00am, after we shower and dress, but before we take breakfast. In the evening we water them mostly after dinner. We use a hose pipe connected to a water tap, and some of us use buckets and watering cans." Tereza

NO CHILD FORGOTTEN

"Growing up has been a difficult affair for me and my parents. I sometimes lack self-esteem before fellow people. But later I realised that disability is not inability, and resolved to better my life. I had to learn how to adapt to the world, because I learned the world won't always adapt to me."

Bilan contracted polio at age 5. Now, she aims to lecture in English at University!

TAUGHT – TO TEACH!

Zainab has been a refugee her whole life. Born in a camp at Dadaab in Kenya, she is now 25, and has been teaching at Upendo* Primary School inside the refugee camp for five years. (*Upendo is the Swahili word for 'love'.)

"When I was a student, we had no teacher from our community. Therefore, communication barriers made it difficult to understand what was being taught. To learn effectively, young children need to be taught in their local language in order to boost their understanding."

Children living through a refugee crisis have often suffered trauma, and school is a proven way to help them recover. School offers safety, routine, fun, new friends, play-time, learning ... and a daily school lunch.

Your **Gifts of Grace** can support a teacher like Zainab working inside a refugee camp for one month. You provide training to upgrade skills and classroom management, and also to provide inclusive learning to students with disabilities.



Seeds for success!

Before help through ALWS, Tara could not grow enough food to feed her family. She was taught how to make organic fertiliser, grow off-season vegetables, and use hothouse tunnels to increase yield. The farm can now support the family.

BEST OF THE BUNCH!

A women's Farmers Group in Indonesia decided to value-add to the bananas and taro they grew - by turning them into chips!

The entrepreneurs were supported with:

- 2 x deep-fryers
- 1 x scales
- 2 x mandolin
- 2 x big plastic buckets
- 2 x metal sieves
- 2 x large metal fryer spoons
- 1 x machine to seal plastic bags
- 1 x hot air fryer also fries fish

The women use their profits to buy farming equipment to further increase their income.


NEW: YOUR GIFT!

When Effendi was 16, a disease left him unable to walk. Before he came to the Hephata Centre, operated by the Lutheran community in Indonesia, Effendi struggled.

"I was feeling very distressed because my brain was working, but my body was not. At the Centre, I saw many others with disability. Many of them could not talk or think properly, but they were laughing and happy. This changed my mindset."

Now, Effendi and wife Betty, have set up a Batik business. They create unique Christmas ornaments, alongside other people with disabilities, by sticking their own batik design to recycled CDs.

YOUR CLUCKY DAY!

"My biggest happiness is that my husband is sharing the work with me. We are making decisions together. I am stronger and sending five children to school. My heart is strong. Since this training I am healthier and more confident".

Laxmi's daughter has severe disability. The family are poor. You supply three chickens, start-off food pack, water and food bowls, vaccine and vitamins, rice husks and training. Cheep to give, but eggstremely precious!

"Piglets are healthy, my business is fine. Looking back a few short years and over the obstacles I overcame, I couldn't imagine where I am today. I can now support myself and my family without relying on foreign wage labour because of my pig farming business."

When this little piggie goes to market, it produces profits to help support a family. You can kick-start a new business with a piglet, or 'go the whole hog' and set-up a pig farm with 2 x piglets + secure pig-sty + food for one month!

"After the big tsunami, people became aware that if we had mangroves again there would be less impact from king tides or tsunamis. I am happy to see the enthusiasm of the community to plant today. I feel very proud and that in the future we can be safe from the waves."

Provide 50 metres of piping to help the Turkana community in Kenya irrigate capsicum, kale, spinach and tomatoes. Healthy food for children, and surplus to sell! Veggie, veggie good!



WATER-BOUT ME?

"Before, we must walk long way for water. Now, the water just flows to the net houses. It is put on in the morning and when the vegetables have enough water, it is put off."

"Before the project, I had to work as a laborer in the fields to get money. I was so poor that I didn't have soap to wash my clothes. I had no farm animals.

My land is 40 x 35 m. I planted 12 kilos of seeds but only harvested 20 kilos. Now, with organic manure and fertiliser, for the same area I harvested 100 kilos of beans. I used to use 5 kilos of corn seed and harvest 35 kilos. After the training, I harvested 200 kilos."




